

Catalog Updates

Students should note the following approved changes to programs, courses, and policies, effective 8/31/2023 that occurred after the publication of the 2023-2024 Academic Catalog.

- Cuisines of Africa and its Diaspora in the Americas has been added as a new concentration for most bachelor degree programs.

Students should note the following approved changes to programs, courses, and policies, effective 12/15/2023 that occurred after the publication of the 2023-2024 Academic Catalog.

- Academic Review: The individual records of students who are recommended by a faculty member or the registrar for suspension or dismissal due to academic dishonesty will be reviewed by the Academic Standards Committee.
- Attendance Policy updated to include section on Special Considerations.
- The Bachelor of Business Administration degree in Food Business Management in New York has added an optional capstone experience. Students may now choose Foodservice Management or Business Planning.
- The Master of Professional Studies in Sustainable Food Systems has added a third residency (MSFS-501C) and reduced the credits for the Applied Project in Food System Sustainability (MSFS-581) to 2 credits. The program remains at 30 total credits.
- The Texas Workforce Commission has been removed from the Accreditation/Approvals section.
- Withdrawal Refund Policy for Texas campus was updated for Spring 2024 forward.
